



MATHS

Children will add and subtract numbers within 100. They will add/subtract one to and from a 2 digit number. They will find ten more and ten less than a number and investigate multiplication.

Key Vocabulary: add, subtract, multiplication.

HISTORY

Children will investigate the question 'How did the Great Fire change London?' They will look at the conditions that caused the fire to spread and create a timeline to show the events of 1666.

Key Vocabulary: fire, spread, effect, chronology.

COMPUTING

Children will be learning how to present information that they have found. They will learn about the importance of fact checking and not believing everything that you read online.

Key Vocabulary: internet, trust, data, facts.

ENGLISH

Children will read a range of alternative traditional tales and then write a newspaper report, an alternative ending to a tale and their own traditional tale with a twist.

Key Vocabulary: alternative, characters, plot.

ART

Children will create a piece of art inspired by the Great Fire of London using marbling and printing to create effect. They will choose and mix colours to represent different temperatures.

Key Vocabulary: marbling, effect, silhouette.

MUSIC

Children will explore how sounds can communicate atmosphere and help to tell a story. They will compose music to accompany the telling of a story. They will also learn about orchestral instruments.

Key Vocabulary: orchestral, instruments, story.

RE

Children will be learning why Christmas is important to Christians. They will recognise traditions and rituals for celebrating Christmas.

Key Vocabulary: Jesus, God, Christmas, advent, celebration.

SCIENCE

Children will identify, name and describe an object in terms of the material that it is made from and they will be able to explain whether it is natural or man-made. They will sort materials linked to their properties.

Key Vocabulary: natural, man-made, material.

PE

Children will work together in teams to develop their team building skills through a range of different activities.

Key Vocabulary: agility, skills, team, perseverance.

PSHE / RSE

Children will learn about rules, rights and responsibilities and why they are important. They will have a chance to reflect on their responsibilities.

Key Vocabulary: rules, rights, responsibilities.
